

PARENTS, GREAT NEWS – WE WILL BE IN THE MODULARS ON MONDAY!

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW AND WE HAVE ANSWERS TO GIVE YOU.

- G.S. Jones Restoration Company will pick up all student & teacher materials on Monday morning and deliver to classrooms. Desks, chairs, etc will already be there. A sketch of classrooms is shown below.
- Each grade is in a separate room. Upper elementary students will need to go outside to change classes. All classrooms will be protected by Guardian Protection Services and will be locked at night and unlocked in the morning.
- Bus students will be taken directly to St. Ursula and dropped off on Cella Street in front of the modulars. A fence will surround the modulars with an opening on Cella Street. Students that are driven should also be left off at the same entrance. If you need to park remember you cannot block the bus routes or entrance to school or playground. Parking is at a premium.
- Lunch will be in the church basement. The students will walk down the steps and through the bottom patio doors on Kirk. You received a menu on Monday. Cafeteria helpers are scheduled.
- Each modular has a phone that is for emergency use only. It will not take any other outgoing calls. Each also has a restroom.
- Afterschool will be in the church basement for now.
- Please be patient- we are still working on the details. It's a big move!
